ARAVILLA CLEARWATER VISITATION POLICY AND PROCEDURES DURING FACILITY OUTBREAK OF COVID-19

Florida State Bill (SB) 988, the *No Patient Left Alone Act*, guarantees Florida families the fundamental right to visit their loved ones who are receiving care in hospitals, hospices, and long-term care facilities. No health care facility in Florida may require a vaccine as a condition of visitation and every health care facility must allow their residents and patients to be hugged by their loved ones. SB 988 states health care facilities must allow in-person visitation in all of the following circumstances, unless the resident, client, or patient objects:

- End-of-life situations.
- A resident, client, or patient who was living with family before being admitted to the provider's care is struggling with the change in environment and lack of in-person family support.
- A resident, client, or patient is making one or more major medical decisions.
- A resident, client, or patient is experiencing emotional distress or grieving the loss of a friend or family member who recently died.
- A resident, client, or patient needs cueing or encouragement to eat or drink which was previously provided by a family member or caregiver.
- A resident, client, or patient who used to talk and interact with others is seldom speaking.

Aravilla Clearwater Assisted Living requires the following procedures to comply with Florida Statutes 400.022(1)(b) and 429.28(1). Before in-person visitation is permitted, all visitors and Essential Caregiver's must adhere to following:

- 1. Sign in upon entering the facility before interaction with others.
- 2. Comply with the *Infection Control Education for Visitors*, which may require visitors to wear PPE including a face mask and other necessary PPE and perform hand hygiene. Staff can demonstrate the proper usage of PPE.
- 3. The visitor shall sign the policy acknowledging an understanding the visitation policy. Failure to adhere to the policy shall result in suspension of in-person visitation.
- 4. Submit to a screening which may include temperatures and/or a questionnaire about current health status.
- 5. Visitation hours are 8am to 8pm.
